SPARKING INNOVATION TRAINING SESSION AT MAASAI MARA UNIVERSITY

Maasai Mara University, a leading institution of higher learning in Kenya, took a significant step towards fostering innovation on 24th Jan 2024 with a training session titled "How to Promote Innovation in Institutes of Higher Learning: A Case Study of Maasai Mara University." The session, opened by the esteemed Prof. P. Aloo Obudho, Vice Chancellor and facilitated by the renowned Dr. Tony Omwenga, CEO KeNIA, proved to be an enriching and engaging experience for all participants.

The core focus of the training revolved around the Entrepreneurial Institutions Maturity Framework (EIMF), a valuable tool designed to guide aspiring entrepreneurial universities on their journey towards fostering innovation and entrepreneurship within their academic ecosystems. Dr. Omwenga delved into the key aspects of the EIMF, including its application to higher education institutions, its differentiation between traditional and emerging entrepreneurial universities, and the

critical role of entrepreneurship in today's world.

To illustrate the transformative power of entrepreneurial universities, Dr. Omwenga presented compelling case studies. Participants learned about the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) Licensing Office, which has generated over \$3 billion in licensing revenue since 1986, and the University of Waterloo's Velocity program, a successful start-up incubator that has empowered entrepreneurs to raise over \$800 million in funding. Additionally, Oxford University Innovation, a renowned technology transfer office, showcased its impressive track record of supporting over 160 spinout companies and generating over £90 million in licensing revenue.

Beyond the EIMF and case studies, the training session explored crucial elements for building a thriving entrepreneurial university.

Maasai Mara University conducted a training of Quality Management System (QMS) for its 32 selected staff members as Internal Quality Auditors, drawn from both academic and administrative divisions, focusing on ISO 9001:2015 and ISO 19011:2018 standards. The training took five days, from 12th to 16th January 2024 at Esikar Gardens Hotel in Narok and was facilitated by Mr. Martin Wekesa Nyongesa, the Director of Great Conkors East Africa Limited (GCEAL). The opening and closing ceremonies of the training workshop were presided over by Prof. James S. Nampushi, the Acting DVC (AF&S) on behalf of the Vice-Chancellor, Professor P. Aloo-Obudho. The entire exercise of the training was coordinated by Mr. Moses Okombo, the Assistant Registrar (PC&QMS). The objective of the training programme was to equip the participants with the knowledge and skills necessary for conducting quality internal audits based on the standards of the

5th Edition of the International Organization for Standardization (ISO). It covered seven key topics: an overview of quality management, understanding ISO 9001:2015 and ISO 19011:2018 standards, documented information for the quality management system, terminologies and principles of auditing, audit process, audit preparation and conducting the audit.

At the end of the training, participants underwent a 90-minute examination, with successful ones receiving certificates of completion. The facilitator, Mr. Nyongesa, advised all auditors to familiarize themselves further with the ISO standards and the university's applicable QMS documents to enhance their auditing skills. He further recommended that the University Management should organize to train and sensitize all QMS process owners and implementors.

Maasai Mara University took a significant step towards environmental conservation in Narok County by launching 30 environmental clubs in primary schools in Narok County. The launch event, held on February 9th, 2024 was a remarkable initiative with the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Peninah Aloo-Obudho hosting the Director General of the National Environmental Management Authority (NEMA)- Mamo Boru Mamo who graced the occasion as the chief guest. The event aimed to not only promote environmental awareness but also foster a culture of sustainability among the younger generation. Mr. Mamo commended Maasai Mara University for taking a leadership role in nurturing environmental stewardship at the grassroots level. Each school was represented by 5 students and two teachers referred to as patrons. The diversity of schools and participants showcased a collective commitment to environmental conservation across the region. During the launch, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. P. Aloo-Obudho said that the project is targeting young children because they will grow up with respect for the environment.

She informed the participants that the event is part of the initiative by the First Lady of the Republic of Kenya who launched a model Tree and Fruit Nursery at Maasai Mara University. In his remarks, Reverend Dawson Mudenyoo representing Mama Doing Good lauded Maasai Mara University for taking the lead in promoting environmental conservation activities.

Activities and Highlights:

Distribution of Tree Seedlings and Tree Nursery Development Manual: Each participating school was provided with tree seedlings to kickstart their own tree planting initiatives together with a manual on tree nursery development and management.

The launch of 30 environmental clubs in primary schools by Maasai Mara University was a resounding success, marked by the establishment of the Maasai Mara University Environment clubs' corner by the Vice-Chancellor and the Director General NEMA. The University envisions expanding this initiative to 100 primary schools in the future.

A team from Windle International Kenya (WIK) led by Ms. Phyllis Mureu, the Executive Director visited Maasai Mara University on Tuesday 6th February 2024. They were welcomed by the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Peninah Aloo-Obudho. The objective of the visit was to sign a framework of agreement between Windle International Kenya and Maasai Mara University.

A meeting was held between the two teams to discuss possible areas of collaboration between Maasai Mara University and WIK. The Vice-Chancellor welcomed the Windle International Kenya team led by Ms. Phyllis Mureu - the Executive Director to Maasai Mara University and acknowledged the journey she has walked with Windle International Kenya way back while she was at Kenyatta University as Director Career Services, and at Karatina University, as the Deputy Vice-Chancellor in charge of Academics.

The VC acknowledged the noble role by WIK in uplifting the lives of refugees and vulnerable communities. In addition, she confirmed that Maasai Mara University was ready to partner with WIK in areas of mutual interest. WIK CEO, Ms Mureu appreciated the warm welcome and gave a brief about WIK. She stated that Windle International Kenya (WIK) is a Non-governmental Organization (NGO), based in Nairobi and its aim is to improve the education and livelihood opportunities for refugees and vulnerable communities affected by conflicts and displacement. It provides support for those communities in Dadaab, Kakuma Refugee camps and Kalobeyei integrated settlement to access quality education and training (Secondary, Tertiary and Vocational training Colleges). WIK manages tertiary education scholarships at Certificate, Diploma, degree and postgraduate levels.

Maasai Mara University recently signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Galilee International Management Institute in Israel. The purpose of the MOU is to explore areas of cooperation in order to develop capacity building activities, research and other programmes. In implementing the MOU, either Party will be expected to exchange information that promotes the best practices with respect to policies and procedures particularly those related to quality assurance of joint activities. The key areas in the collaboration include joint research activities, exchange of staff and students, capacity building, joint seminars, conferences and workshops and any other activities as the parties may deem fit.

The MOU will cover the components of the university niche including Tourism, Natural Resource conservation and Management. Galilee International Management Institute is an internationally recognized institution with regard to capacity building of leaders in institutions of higher education. The MOU will enhance collaboration between the University and international organizations. The understanding will last for a period of three (3) years and will be reviewed subject to successful implementation.
